Tom Mallouk's refreshing book *The Write Metaphor* reveals what it means to fully live the life of a poet. The voice is honest, and compassionate with a fine measure of humor. Mallouk reminds us of the *rush of new love* of the first draft, inevitably followed by the next morning's *cold snap of embarrassment* that ultimately sparks revision, a *pruning away of each excessive syllable*. He invites us to read slowly, to taste poetry, "each word a savored morsel." Mallouk calls us to believe *poetry can save a life* even as he pays exquisite tribute to a poet friend whose life could not be saved. *From beyond the self where few have gone before her voice calls out like a desolate gull*... The speaker is brave enough to say, *for what is a poet but one who wants their words to be heard?* And also wise enough to declare *Since God created everything/to appreciate anything is a kind of prayer*. I believe Tom Mallouk's *The Write Metaphor* is a glorious prayer for his life as a poet, for poetry itself, and for the world he illuminates through appreciating *each ordinary thing*.


